PROCESS WASTE


Sort waste to make it easier to throw away, recycle, or reuse.

All these waste types are disposed via registered vendors for recycling purposes and to create an economic value.






FOOD WASTE


All food waste is sent to a pig farm to feed pigs through a registered supplier.






