From its inception, the resort was conceived to uphold the ethos of sustainability across the three pillars of social, environmental and economic; aka people, planet and profit. The resort, part of the Aitken Spence Hotels portfolio – the hospitality arm of the Sri Lankan blue-chip conglomerate Aitken Spence PLC – is no stranger to sustainability.

With flagship resorts such as Heritance Kandalama Sri Lanka under its belt (first LEED* certified hotel in the world and first Green Globe certified hotel in Asia), Aitken Spence Hotels has been a pioneer in sustainable hospitality, years prior to sustainability reaching its current 'trend' status. Hence, it was no surprise when the hotel chain focused on sustainability as a priority when designing the resort, Heritance Aarah.

Having opened its doors in 2019, after two decades of experience in the Maldives under the Adaaran brand of resorts, Heritance Aarah soon won the coveted LEED certificate (Gold level) in the same year – becoming the first building in the Maldives to receive the honour. The resort was also the first green-rated building/resort in the Maldives by the Green Building Council of Sri Lanka (GBCSL).

Energy conservation and reduction of carbon footprint

Our effort is to reduce energy consumption. As a result of the covid-19 pandemic situation and travel restrictions, the property had not operated for almost 06 months, from April 2020 to September 2020. However, for the upkeep and continuity of the quality and standards, even without business, there was a significant amount of energy being used.

As a result, of low occupancy numbers of Average Guest Night / Energy Usage has reduced significantly and we strongly believe that with the ease of travel restrictions and with the new normal, we will be back on track very soon, which will increase energy usage in future.

- Guests are encouraged to follow the towel reuse programme of guest rooms
- Bath Towel Re-use Method minimizes excessive use of water chemicals and energy
- Daily monitoring of power consumption and diesel consumption by section.
- The resort is 30% energy is efficient, compared to a conventional hotel/resort of the same scale.
- The entire resort's hot water requirement is generated through heat recovery from the generator.
- We utilize solar energy in the capacity of 320.7 kwp.
- We save 13% from the total energy load, having installed 1,125 solar panels covering an area of 1.920 sqm.
- All lighting fixtures are energy-efficient LEDs, supporting the reduction of energy demands.
- The resort is equipped with VRF and invertor-type air conditioning units known for high efficiencies.
- Photocell system & timers are in place, especially as exterior lights for gardens and villas.
- We have reduced energy wastage by incorporating a key card system, which is the only model used to switch on electricity in Villas.

Conservation of water in resort activities

As a hospitality partner engaged in the Maldives, water is an essential commodity that has various applications throughout the business. The effective and efficient use of resources is, therefore, vital. We have been able to maintain water-saving best practices and will be continuing to conserve water in a sustainable manner.

- Frequent testing of water for quality assurance.
- Introduce a water outlet aerator system to save water.
- Laundry Maximize the load for laundry minimizes water usage.
- The resort uses biodegradable chemicals that do not harm the environment.
- Periodically monitoring the water flow rate for keeping the Travelife standard.
- Bath Towel Re-use Method saves excessive use of water chemicals and energy.
- \bullet All wastewater (100%) is recycled and reused for gardening and W/C flushing systems.
- Sectional water usage is monitored daily for a better understanding of water leaks and overuse.
- A dedicated member is on alert at all hours of the day for any urgent repairs or water system leaks.
- Sprinklers in the garden and Watering only takes place during early mornings and evenings to save water.
- Rainwater harvesting is conducted and the water this gathered is used for island agriculture /gardening.
- Our Usage of Biodegradable Chemicals in their Daily Activities does not harm the water and STP process.
- Heritance Aarah houses a homemade sparkling and still water bottle plant to reduce single-use plastic on the island.

Waste Management Efforts

Our effort is to reduce and reuse possible waste to practice waste to wealth practice at our properties. All waste that accumulates in our operation is identified and necessary actions / best practices are taken place. Due to the covid-19 pandemic, other than regular waste, a considerable number of biohazard waste were collected. These included single-use personal protective equipment and to ensure a covid-free environment for the betterment of all living beings, biohazard waste was destroyed using a property incinerator. Specially trained associates were used to handle biohazard waste at each property. The process will continue further till the pandemic comes to an end.

- Waste is separated at the source level and disposed of accordingly by trained associates.
- Heritance Aarah houses a homemade sparkling and still water bottle plant to reduce singleuse plastic on the island.
- All waste is appropriately segregated, recorded, and transferred without harm, back into the environment.
- The resort produces its own 100% ecofriendly fertilizer, which helps minimize chemical fertilizer usage.
- Items are reused and converted into other useful items (e.g.: upcycling oil barrels into seats, creating ashtrays, etc)
- All wastewater (100%) is recycled and reused for gardening and W/C flushing systems.
- Biohazard waste is separated and destroyed at premises using a property incinerator by trained associates.
- The purchasing policy maximizes the purchase of sustainable products which are recyclable, more durable, long-lasting, organic and less harmful to the environment.
- The resort produces its own 100% ecofriendly fertilizer, which helps minimize chemical fertilizer usage and reduces the amount of waste disposal.

People, culture and social wellbeing

- Based on the brand tagline of 'where tradition is alive, we have developed a Maldivian Village Live Museum experience within the resort. The museum creates awareness to all visitors including students who visit from nearby atolls, on the history of the Maldives.
- We provide gainful employment opportunities to local communities and source local produce wherever possible in order to uplift the local economy and way of life. This includes (but is not limited to) fresh tuna, coconut products and locally grown vegetable and fruit
- Our purchasing policy maximizes the purchase of sustainable products which are recyclable, more durable, long-lasting, organic and less harmful to the environment
- We invest in people-staff development programs that are rolled out for school leavers and educationally-challenged youth to find gainful opportunities in the hospitality industry.
- We welcome students from schools, institutions and youth communities to visit and experience hotel operations, in line with local safety guidelines.

Biodiversity conservation

- The resort has its own vegetable and herb garden within its premises the Aarah Tharukaaree Dhandu.
- We conduct regular coral and tree-planting activities, coastal clean-ups and dive clean-up, guests and associates.
- We ONLY use native and adapted plants for the landscape of the island, to protect its biodiversity.
- We do not engage in uprooting or burning trees on the island without authorization. This is to ensure that the island is safe and welcoming to wildlife and the natural habitat.
- Guests, local community and associates are constantly made aware of flora and fauna; and other sustainability practices.


